DEFINITIONS

 institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an

 available after a student completes an applicable educational program.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

- 1. You have the right to cancel your agreement for a program of instruction, without any penalty or obligations, through attendance at the first class session or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time; and you have the right to receive a pro-rata refund if you have completed less than 60 percent of the scheduled days in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance.
- Cancellation may occur when the student provides a written notice of cancellation at the following address:
 Fremont College, 18000 Studebaker Road, 9th Floor, Cerritos, CA 90703. This can be done by mail, email,
 or by hand delivery. Cancellation may also occur by the student's non-attendance through the end of the
 add/drop period
- 3. The written notice, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with proper postage. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement.
- 4. If the Enrollment Agreement is cancelled within seven days, the school will refund the student all monies paid, less a registration or administration fee, not to exceed \$250, within 45 days after the notice of cancellation is received.
