The annual graduation rate is calculated based on a cohort of full-time, first-time, degree/certificate-seeking students, enrolled from September 1, 2016 through August 31, 2017 and who completed their program within 150% of the normal time as of August 31, 2021. The graduation rate is based on data reported by the school in connection with the *2022-23 IPEDS Winter Collection (Graduation Rate Survey)*. This rate does not include students who left school to serve in the armed forces (or have been called up to active duty), on an official church mission, or with a foreign aid service of the federal government, or for students who died or became permanently disabled.

Since these programs are completion programs students entering these programs are not considered first-time students.*
